Biography of Nazareth Donjoian

Naz, as he is better known by, was born November 22, 1924. He was born at home, as was the custom at the time for many people. He had three sisters; one older and two younger sister. Both his mother (Armenouhi) and father (Kasper) immigrated to this country from Armenia. His father came to this country first and settled in Granite City. A friend of his returned to Armenia for a wife and Naz's father had him pick a woman to come to America for him to marry. So his father never met his future wife until she arrived in Granite City.

His mother had been married previously and had four children. All four children died in Armenia of natural causes, Naz believes. He also believes that her husband was killed in the Armenian massacre. In any event, she came to America with the intent of marrying Kasper. However, Kasper was not happy her when she first arrived, for unknown reasons. However, after several other bachelors expressed the desire to marry her if Kasper chose not to, Kasper reconsidered. He felt if others expressed an interest in her, maybe she was worth marrying after all!!

His father was a chef and ran a tavern and boarding house for many years. Naz also owned and ran a tavern for a number of years. While in high school, Naz got a job at the U.S. Army depot just down the street and worked there for part of his senior year. After graduation, he worked there a short period of time at the depot before being drafted. he entered the U.S. Army in June 1943 and was assigned to the U.S. Army Air Corps. He received training as a airplane and engine mechanic and spent a total of 32 months in the military. The war ended before he was shipped overseas and upon discharge he returned to Granite City.

He had return rights to his former job at the depot. After being home for two weeks and listening to his dad constantly asking him when he was going to get a job, Naz returned to work a the depot. He held a number of jobs and over the years suffered a number of Reduction In Force (RIF) realignments of personnel. However, after each RIF he was fortunate enough to move up in pay grade and after forty two years of combined military and civilian service, retired as a GS-12.

He lived at home until marriage. Not wanting to be labeled a bachelor, her married two days before his thirty sixth birthday, to a girl from St. Louis he had met on a blind date. His wife was raised in an orphanage, and they adopted two children because they could not have children of their own. They adopted a boy, John Paul and a girl, Patricia Ann. His wife died before ever seeing any of her grandchildren. His children live in the Greater St. Louis area and he is able to see his grandchildren regularly.

Naz attends the Armenian church regularly and assists at his church functions. He is also involved in other community activities.
