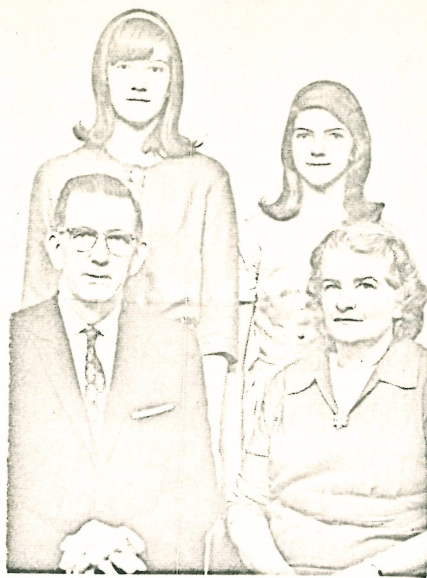


Dear Ev:
